TOPIC: Three explosions occurred on London's subway system and one bombing blew apart a double-decker bus during this morning's rush hour commute, according to an article by The Associated Press. At least 40 people were killed and more than 700 were wounded. A group called "The Secret Organization of al-Qaida in Europe" has claimed responsibility for the attacks, but the authenticity of the statement has yet to be confirmed. Many European countries, as well as the United States, have heightened their security in airports, railways and subways. European stocks quickly dropped after the attacks and exchanges in London, Paris and Germany were all down 2 percent.
